Gregg Petri**, and many alumni who will be gathering for a fun-filled, nostalgic, spiritual, Franciscan weekend.

The twin cities of Bloomington and Normal are home to Illinois State University, Illinois Wesleyan University, State Farm Insurance Company, Country Financial, Mitsubishi Motors North America, Miller Park Zoo, several golf courses, two large hospitals, professional baseball, basketball, hockey and arena football teams, many shopping areas and restaurants and much more. Bloomington and Normal are located in Central Illinois about halfway between St. Louis, Missouri and Chicago, Illinois. You can travel to Bloomington/Normal by automobile via Interstate Highways I-74, I-55 and I-39. It is about a five hour drive from Cincinnati to Bloomington on I-74. The airport in Bloomington is the Central Illinois Regional Airport (CIRA). The website for the airport is <u>www.cira.com</u>. Another nearby airport is the Peoria International Airport in Peoria, Illinois. This airport is about 50 minutes away from our selected hotel in Bloomington via I-74. Those traveling to Bloomington from the Chicago area or the St. Louis area might consider taking the train. The twin cities are well served by Amtrak. If you prefer to travel by bus, there is a Greyhound bus station in Bloomington.

The Rachel Statue

The Saturday evening dinner at our 2012 Chapter Reunion was prepared and served by the Knights of Columbus of St. Maximilian Kolbe Parish in Liberty Township, OH, which counts Paul Landers ('76) and Deacon Mike Lippman ('76) among its members. As a gesture of appreciation to the Knights, the Franciscan Alumni Association donated \$300 toward their campaign to purchase a statue of "Rachel Weeping for Her Children."

On Right to Life Weekend (Oct. 1, 2011), the official ceremony was held to dedicate the statue to the unborn lost to abortion and to all those who mourn the loss of a child.

The bronze limited edition (#9 of 12) sculpture was designed by Sondra L. Jonson of Nebraska. It sits on a 3,600 pound red granite stone which was found on a farm in Ross County, probably pushed down to southern Ohio by the Great Glacier which formed the hills of southern Ohio.

Artist Jonson says that she designed the statue "to reflect a society bereaved of its

children and looking to God for healing and redemption" and placed a rose at Ra-



chel's side as a "sign of her confidence in God and hope for her future."

The story of Rachel and Jacob and their

family are found in the Book of Genesis, and Jeremiah 31:15, 16 tells of Rachel's weeping for her children who have gone into exile. Matthew quotes Jeremiah when Mary and Joseph escape Bethlehem when the Innocents (boys under two years old) are being slaughtered by Herod in his attempt to kill Jesus (Matthew 2:18). Jacob's children are often referred to as the founders of the 12 tribes of Israel

(another name for Jacob).

Rachel was an Old Testament matriarch, the wife of Jacob for whom he worked many years for the honor of marrying. She was the mother of Joseph (of the coat of many colors) and Benjamin. She longed for children and died in Benjamin's childbirth. She was buried outside Bethlehem; her tomb is visited by Jews, Muslims, and Christians alike. Project Rachel and Priests for Life have chosen her to represent their efforts to promote life. It is the Knights' wish that this statue will inspire those who contemplate abortion to choose life and to help those in need of consolation and healing to find hope.




