Thursday, June 23: The spacious Campanas Clubhouse in JD's neighborhood is reserved for us the entire day and evening. Arrive as early as noon and stay as long as you like. Enjoy hors d'oeuvres, drinks, conversation, swimming in the large pool, TV, and billiards. This is the site of the welcome event and dinner.

Friday, June 24: After optional 8 am morning prayer and complimentary breakfast, enjoy sightseeing and other fun activities in and around San Antonio: Historic missions, the Alamo, Tower of the Americas, San Fernando Cathedral, Japanese Tea Garden, El Mercado, Botanical Garden, and Zoo/Aquarium. In the



evening, cruise or walk along the River Walk and have dinner there if you wish. JD has arranged for a great deal on a boat tour, followed by dinner at an awesome restaurant. The boat tour is only \$10. We'll need to be there at 5:15 for a 5:30 ride along the picturesque River Walk (San Antonio River, downtown). We'll have 2 chartered boats, just for our group.

The dinner at Ambler Restaurant (inside Hotel Contessa) sounds terrific: 5-course meal with dessert and coffee/tea. The boat picks up and drops off at the restaurant along the

River Walk, which is convenient. There's also a pay-as-you-go bar. We'll have a party room just for us. JD negotiated the dinner price down to \$69 per person, with tax and gratuity included. The initial price was over \$100! Seating is limited for the boat and the restaurant. Payment will be needed in advance in order to reserve your seats. 


Friar Honorees Gifted, Versatile by Henry Beck, OFM '70



Every year the Board of the Franciscan Alumni Assn. talks about Franciscan alumni to be honored with our Christian Life Award and our Humanitarian Award. These awards are usually given at our annual FAA Reunion in June, though Covid-19 has interrupted our reunions for the past two years. In 2021, the Board chose to honor the memory and life of **Fr. Joe Rayes** with the Christian Life Award. Many of us gained much from Joe when he served as Novice Master in the province. Others knew him through his inspired preaching, retreats, and spiritual direction. Joe continues to be held in high regard among us alumni, and we wanted to recognize his many gifts and contributions.

The Board also chose to honor **Br. Scott Obrecht** in 2021 with the Humanitarian Award. In making the announcement, **Rick Kasper**, Chair of the Awards Committee, explained, "We have based our decision on the many, many years of service you have given to the people of the Philippines, the Southwest missions, to the provincial Mission Office, and to Friars Club. It is also amazing that you were instrumental in bringing [St.] Mother Teresa of Calcutta to Cincinnati [in 1981] to speak to the province and friends of the province. We sincerely thank you, Scott, and honor you with this award."

I was blessed to be given the plaque from Rick to give to Scott when I returned from vacation. Here he is, holding the FAA Humanitarian Award in our meditation garden at St. Francis Retreat House in Easton, Pa. Congratulations, Scott!

US 6 Franciscans: Update on the Process toward Unification by Henry Beck, OFM '70

Many of you in our Franciscan Alumni Association may be aware of the ongoing effort to **merge six of the seven USA OFM provinces**. The provinces engaged in this unification process are: St. John the Baptist, Our Lady of Guadalupe, Holy Name, Assumption of the BVM, Sacred Heart, and St. Barbara.

We have been working toward this union for several years now. All will come together in a gathering of friars and a celebration of a **Chapter of Unity in October 2023**. Though the pandemic has slowed some of our efforts to meet together in person, we have been able to continue the work and dialogue through Zoom meetings.

In the past several months, the process has begun to build momentum for the union of the six provinces into one "coast-to-coast" province. The steering committee has been conducting "Friars in Focus" meetings on Zoom to help friars discuss topics like the new name of the province, the automobile policy for the new province, immigration concerns, and new kinds of "fraternities in mission" that are developing.

There will soon be an announcement of the new site for our provincial curia (offices). The new provincial name is developing along a process of engagement with the friars. As this process of "revitalization and restructuring" has been developing, we on the FAA Board have also been discussing our possible future as a national association of those who participated in the various formation programs, and those who assisted us in these programs in the provinces. During the FAA Reunions of 2022 and 2023 we will be reflecting on these steps together. In 2022 we hope to reflect on "Who are we now?" and in 2023 the question will be "Who do we want to be in the future?" We hope you will come and help us develop the future of the association.

Covid Note for 2022 Reunion

The FAA Board of Trustees takes the safety of its members seriously, going as far as postponing the past two reunions in order to keep everyone safe.

During this year's reunion, the FAA strongly recommends and requests that everyone who attends be vaccinated or have a negative COVID test during the two days prior to arriving at the reunion. We on the FAA

Board and the 2022 Reunion Planning Team also recommend the wearing of masks and social distancing if the circumstances warrant this in June.

The overarching question for our interest and involvement is, "How does the Franciscan Alumni Association align with, and participate in, the newly created province?" As we discussed this question, it became apparent that our Mission Statement, a formal summary of the aims and values of our organization, needed to be updated. After several months of discussion and revision, the Board adopted the following Mission Statement in April of 2021:
